

Sub: opening of “Sthree Toilet”at Kempegowda bus station.

KSRTC converted a Scrap Bus into Sthree Toilet. The cost of the toilet for the bus has been paid by the Bengaluru International Airport Authority as part of their CSR. The total cost is Rs.12 Lakhs. The toilet (Three Indian toilet) (Two western toilet) is equipped with Incinerator and Saniatary napkin vending machine.

Sri.Laxman S. Savadi, Hon’ble Deputy Chief Minister, Transport Department, Govt.of Karnataka, inaugurated “Sthree Toilet’. Sri.Shivayogi C.Kalasad, IAS, Managing Director, KSRTC, Dr. Ram Niwas Sepat, IPS Director (S&V) KSRTC, Sri.Venkateh T, KAS, Director (P&E) and Srhi. Hemanth CSR Head, BIAL, were also present.

Features:

Bus is making use of self-generated power through solar. Bus has solar Sensor lights, hand washing (Wash basin), Baby feeding place, and Baby Diaper changing.

The corporation is convinced that cleanliness is a top concern, providing basic infrastructure to women passengers at bus stops.

KSRTC and Bangalore International Airport Authority (BIAL) Bangalore have been implemented with the help of their CSR fund. KSRTC is the first State Road Transport Undertaking in India implemented this initiative.

Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister mentioned that, KSRTC is implementing Swachch Bhartah Mission initiatives and directed the officials to make use of scrap buses to other useful initiatives especially during on -going Pandemic crisis.

The said bus is not in running condition, so it will be placed in the Kempegowda bus terminal-1
